KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Kenrick Cato, PhD, RN, CPHIMS, FAAN, FACMI is a Professor of Informatics at the University of Pennsylvania School of Nursing and a Nurse Scientist for Pediatric Data and Analytics at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. Dr. Cato has a varied background. He worked as a database engineer and software engineer before serving as an infantryman (enlisted and officer) in the United States Army. He has also worked as an oncology nurse and as an analyst in the information technology department, working on projects to improve patient safety using Clinical decision support.

Dr. Cato is a clinical informatician whose program of research focuses on the mining of electronic patient data to support decision-making for clinicians, patients, and caregivers. Also, he is involved in several national-level informatics organizations, including as a board member of the American Medical Informatics Association (AMIA), the Chair-elect of the Nursing Informatics Working Group (NIWG) of AMIA, as well as a convening member of the AMIA-sponsored 25 x 5 initiative to reduce documentation burden.

CLOSING REMARKS



Dr. Tamara Macieira is an Assistant Professor at the UF College of Nursing and an expert in nursing informatics, standardized terminologies, and data science, with experience in applying machine learning methods in research on aging, mainly the impact of nursing care on patient outcomes for cognitively impaired older adults. Dr. Macieira’s program of research is funded by the NIH-National Institute on Aging and focuses on the implementation of the research-data infrastructure that will generate standardized nursing data and improve readmissions prediction models for older adults with Alzheimer’s Disease and/or Alzheimer’s Disease-Related Dementias.



Nathan Mena started his nursing career at Shands on unit 65 back in the Fall of 2017. Working with Adult med/surg patients as a bedside nurse for over 5 years, he moved into a clinical leader role on unit 67 in the Spring of 2023. Mr. Mena graduated with his MSN in Nursing Education in December of 2021 and has gone on to teach adult med/surg clinicals for both Santa Fe College and the University of Florida.

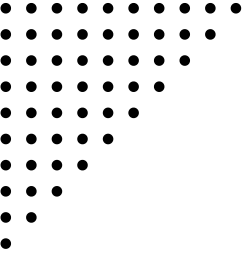
